Getty 25 Community Art Festivals Description

You're invited to a series of 10 free, outdoor community art festivals across Los Angeles this summer in celebration of the Getty Center's 25th anniversary. In partnership with community groups across L.A. County, the festival series kicks off May 14 and runs through August 28. These two-day festivals will feature curated experiences reflective of each community including interactive workshops, live music and performances, an artisan marketplace, food trucks, giveaways, photo booths, and more. Getty will be present with an immersive digital experience of its collections, hands-on library, gift shop, and resources for Getty's job, volunteer, and internship opportunities. Festival materials will be available in multiple languages.

How many festivals are happening throughout the summer?

Eleven. There are ten community-based festivals throughout Los Angeles County, with the final festival in celebration of all ten communities at Getty Center.

Who is producing the festivals?

Getty and Community Arts Resources (CARS) are collaborating with local Community Partners in each neighborhood to produce the festivals.

Why did Getty pick these neighborhoods?

Getty sought to bring an engaging art experience to neighborhoods around Los Angeles from which fewer people are able to visit the Getty Center in person. To celebrate the Getty Center's 25th birthday, we wanted to say "thank you" to Los Angeles by bringing art experiences to where people live, understanding that the Getty Center isn't easily accessible to large parts of Los Angeles. Getty also sought places where they could partner with active cultural organizations already hard at work bringing cultural opportunities to their communities.

Getty is sponsoring these festivals to say "thank you" to Los Angeles, in honor of the 25th anniversary of the opening of the Getty Center, which opened to the public back in 1997.

What are the festivals for?

The intent of these festivals is to celebrate the arts and culture of communities across Los Angeles County as a part of Getty Center's 25th-anniversary celebrations. Each festival is the beginning of a new long-term commitment between each neighborhood and Getty.

What can I do at the festivals?
